Exam Pricing	Standard price (see GED Testing Service Client Reference) Note: Subsidies are often available. When registering, use promo code “mnged10” for \$10 off the first four individual tests.
Identification Requirements	Follow the standard policy in the GED Testing Service Client Reference, and note the additional acceptable MN IDs listed below: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> IDs associated with judicial institutions (jails, juvenile centers, etc.) are acceptable. Tribal Identification is acceptable as long as it meets the standard requirements (signature, photo, and DOB). IDs issued by cities, towns and municipalities are acceptable as long as they meet the standard requirements (signature, photo, and DOB). Renewal papers for state photo IDs are acceptable for six months from the issue date or until the expiration date (whichever is longer). They must include either an attached official photo or a clipped state ID. Do not seat a student for an exam unless he or she provides a valid form of ID. Call the test center support line to contact a program coordinator before turning a student away. Create a case for any ID issues regardless of whether the student was seated or not.
Minimum Age Requirement	The minimum age to test in Minnesota is 17 years old. The minimum age to test without an approval in Minnesota is 19 years old. If there is a student under the age of 19 taking the test at your center, he or she has already been approved for testing by the Minnesota State GED Administrator and the block on the student’s ged.com account has been cleared by the Minnesota Department of Education. Therefore, test administrators <u>DO NOT</u> need to verify that the candidate meets the minimum age requirement. However, you must verify the student's date of birth on the ID against the date of birth in the admission steps. Refer to the GED Testing Service Client Reference for more information.
